

CHANGES TO KATOOMBA WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITY



From Monday 2 March 2020 the conditions of entry at KATOOMBA Resource Recovery and Waste Management Facility (RRWMF) are changing. The RRWMF will only operate as a small vehicle drop off area.

- Only small vehicles up to 4.5 tonnes will be permitted;
- All waste must be unloaded by hand - no tipping; and
- Construction and demolition waste will not be accepted.
You may continue to take construction and demolition waste to Blaxland RRWMF.

Katoomba RRWMF continues to accept mixed household waste, household recyclables, scrap metal, white goods, batteries, gas bottles, engine oil, paints, fluoro light globes, tyres, mattresses, green waste and reusable furniture. Blaxland RRWMF will continue to operate without change and will accept large vehicles and construction and demolition waste.

FAQ'S

Q. What sort of vehicles are less than 4.5 tonnes and more than 4.5 tonnes?

A. Vehicles less than 4.5 tonnes include vans, utes, station wagons and cars with a small trailer. Vehicles more than 4.5 tonnes include tip trucks and semi-trailers.

Q. If my vehicle is under 4.5 tonnes can I still tip my waste?

A. No. All waste needs to be unloaded by hand into sorting bays. No tipping will be permitted.

Q. What if I turn up with a large vehicle with a total weight over 4.5 tonnes? Or have mixed household waste that includes construction and demolition waste?

A. You will be re-directed to Blaxland Resource Recovery and Waste Management Facility.

Q. What is construction and demolition waste?

A. Construction and demolition activities can generate a wide range of different waste materials. Which include, but are not limited to:

- excavated material such as rock and soil;
- waste asphalt, bricks, concrete, plasterboard, and timber;
- asbestos and contaminated soil.

Q. Why have these changes been made to the Katoomba RRWMF?

A. In the interest of public and employee health and safety, Council have decided that the public will only be able to access the small vehicle area. This decision has been made following extensive research and analysis of a variety of options.

Q. Can I do multiple trips in my small vehicle etc.?

A. Yes.
